



"...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." - Acts 1: 8

> I am the church! You are the church! We are the church together! All who follow Jesus, all around the world! Yes, we're the church together!

This month our Choral Benediction will be the refrain from We Are the Church (#558 in the UM Hymnal). Some of you might be wondering why we are singing a children's song as our choral benediction, why we change them monthly, or have one at all. Those are all good and valid questions. The answers to all of your great questions have to do with what it means to live together as the body of Christ in our church family and the world!

> The church is not a building, the church is not a steeple, the church is not a resting place, the church is a people.

We have a choral benediction because it is one last opportunity to raise our voices together as we leave worship empowered by the Holy Spirit to share God's love in the world. The strength that we need to live as Christ followers- loving God, others, and self in ways that are whole and healthy- is one of the gifts of worship. To sing corporately, as a BODY, is a reminder that we are not alone as we go forth into the world to witness to the Good News with our words and deeds.

> We're many kinds of people, with many kinds of faces, all colors and all ages, too, from all times and places.

We change the choral benediction for two reasons: sometimes to reflect a theme that has emerged in the scriptures of our sermons for that month and also to utilize a variety of styles and eras of music and lyrics that reflect the diversity of ages, interests, and musical preferences encompassed in our church family and community. For example, in December we often sing the refrain to Go Tell It On the Mountain because it is a Christmas Hymn; many of us know it and find joy in singing a well known and much beloved refrain during that busy time of year; and it reminds us that we are to go and share the good news of Christ to all the world.

At Pentecost some people received the Holy Spirit and told the Good News through the world to all who would hear it.

This month we are singing We Are the Church for all the reasons listed above. In May, we remember Jesus' Ascension, Pentecost, and Trinity Sunday. In different ways, each of our Sundays in May will celebrate who we are as the church, the body of Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit to live out and share God's redeeming love in the world. We sing a song written for children because we have and welcome children in worship; many remember this song from our own childhoods; and we are all called to a childlike faith in God.

> And when the people gather, there's singing and there's praying, there's laughing and there's crying sometimes, all of it saying:

From Blest Be the Tie that Binds, written in 1782, to We Are the Church, from the 1970s, to All the People Said Amen, written in 2014, these songs and others remind us of who and whose we are: All who follow Jesus, all around the world! Yes, we're the church together! So, empowered by the Holy Spirit, let us go be the church: loving and serving God and the world together!

CHOIR NOTES

CHOIR NOTES by Sylvia Spencer, Choir Director

Five Reasons Why You Should Join Our Choir:

1. <u>Musicality</u> – singing in the choir improves the way you hear music, it draws out your innate musical ability and intensifies your appreciation of harmony. Choir members soon become aware of how harmonies complement each other.

- 2. <u>Mental Health</u>—Studies have shown that the mental health of choral singing include enhanced brain function, strengthened feelings of togetherness, and the release of endorphins and oxytocin resulting in reduced stress and depression.
- 3. <u>Confidence</u>— Unless there's hearing loss, anyone can learn to sing. In the church choir you have permission to make noise as part of the group, and believe me, your confidence will grow.
- 4. <u>Belonging</u> Singing helps to make social bonds, and it does quickly, acting as a powerful ice-breaker. You will feel valued and make friends from individuals from a diversity of backgrounds.
- 5. <u>Aerobic and toning</u>- A singing session is a wonderful workout for the lungs. The actions of warming up, breathing deeply, and opening the diaphragm all oxygenate the blood, creating more white blood cells, which strengthens the whole body. The breathing rate slows and deepens, releasing endorphins and increasing a sense of well-being. All this lung action reduces the chance of illness.

Singing also improves your posture and tones your stomach muscles, and a strong core supports your spine so your body will be less prone to injury as you age.





Dear Friends,

I apologize for not being more communicative in the previous months. I had an amazing gathering with missionaries from around the world in Bogota Columbia in February which allowed me to take a week before to visit the near by Galapagos Islands. You might have seen photos. (Wow what a place! It is possible to travel there on a shoe string. Let me know if you want those details!).

Bogota! The salary support you send me actually pays the salaries of all missionaries and after hearing some of their ministry stories of delivering medical support to remote areas, inner city church pastoring, and teaching under-resourced kids in Mexico I am so proud to be a part of this team! We shared stories of at-

tempting to be that frontline link with the Methodist church mission and our attempts to preserve mind body and soul in the process. I got to hang out with three classmates from my missionary school 9 years ago! I also got to meet the volunteer team of directors for the Board of Global Ministries who were able to make time to be with us. Amidst the divisions in the United Methodist Church I have so much hope for where we are heading!

After that bit of travel I came home to pack boxes, clean house and make the big move to Tucuman, my new place of assignment!



ACROSS THE COURTYARD

May 2024

On a windy, chilly day in March FUMC had church (yes, the Holy Ghost showed up) at Mary Holland Park. If this "praise picnic" had occurred over 50 years ago,

Mary Holland, the park's name sake and a member of FUMC might have been singing along with the Praise Band and eating grilled hot-dogs and hamburgers. One source stated that Mary had a beautiful, clear voice, like a "bobolink trilling in the sun."

A photograph of Mrs. Spessard L. Holland (Mary) appears in our 1973 church directory. Spessard's father, B.F. Holland helped to organize our Bartow Methodist Church, of which their distinguished son became a life long member.

The Hollands split their time between Bartow and Tallahassee (state senatorgovernor) and later Washington D.C. (U.S. Senator). Whenever they were "home" they managed to attend our church to worship and visit with old friends.

Information about Mary says "Mary Holland was for more than just a Florida First Lady or a Senator's Wife. As her husband climbed up the political ranks (she) was by his side each step of the way... She has been described as stylish, smart, and sophisticated... She became a part of her husband's political team. She would sit through legislative sessions on his behalf. taking notes and reporting back to the governor... She remained a force by her husband's side as he became a U.S. Senator..."

It has been noted that "Mary (was) a one-woman (Florida) Chamber of Commerce... She can tell you all about Flori-

da Citrus fruit, cattle, In-land waterways, seashells, fishing, how to cook Florida's game and how to serve grits, her husband eats them every day of his life."

In 1969 Spessard Holland announced his retirement and he died less than a year later in 1970. Spessard's body, with a uniformed honor guard from MacDill Air Force Base in attendance, lay in state in our FUMC sanctuarv. Pastor Rev. Lee R. Van Sickle officiated at his memorial service.

In 1974 the City of Bartow dedicated Mary Holland Park in her honor. This gift to the city was located not far from her home at 1005 South Broadway, where she resided until her death in 1975. She too was memorialized at a service at our church. It has been written of the Holland family, "Once in a lifetime one finds an ideal family with their faith intact in a setting as perfect as if it had come from the pen of an imaginative writer."
